# How it works:

Three pricing options: Free, Standard or Plus.

At the beginning you have to create a team or join a team.

You will need an email address, you will setup a team name, slack URL and username.

You will set your password later using an email you receive from Slack.

You can administrate or be part of more than one team.

You can react to a message. You can quote a message.

You can edit and delete messages.

You can set a status for yourself.

You can share content from the web.

Custom notifications. Custom announcements.
